Product claim: To lighten skin with a high-dose patented combination of active ingredients like Kojic Acid and Emblica in an exfoliating formulation to improve uneven skintone. The technology works to prevent melanin (darker pigment forming cells) from travelling to the skin's surface and causing discolouration.

Smell/texture: It's a rather serious brown cream that doesn't smell particularly attractive but you get the feeling it means business. The texture is fine and a little goes a long way.

Pros: You don't need to use a great deal.

Cons: It leaves your face feeling a little sticky at night.

Results: It definitely faded my darker patches of sun damage in just one month.
