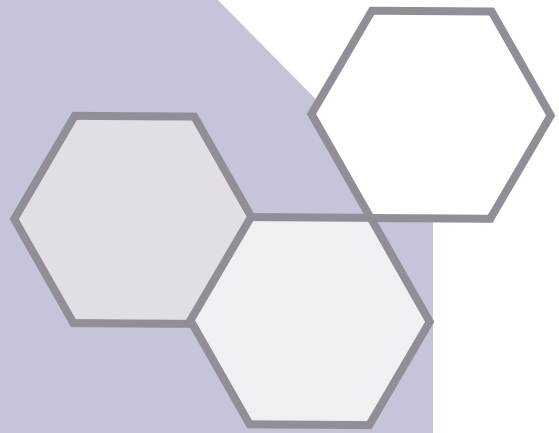

What is Hyperpigmentation?

Hyperpigmentation is a common, usually harmless condition in which **patches of skin become darker** in colour than the normal surrounding skin.

This darkening occurs when an **excess of melanin**, the brown pigment that produces normal skin colour, **forms deposits in the skin**.

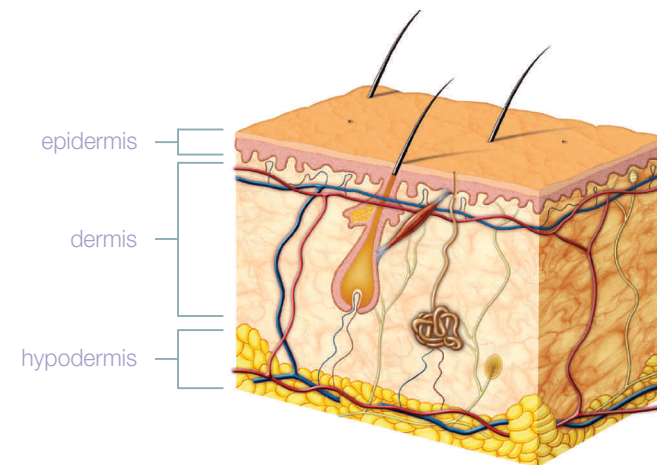


Hyperpigmentation can **affect the skin colour of people of any race** although people with darker Asian, Mediterranean or African skin tones do tend to be more prone to hyperpigmentation, especially if they have **excess sun exposure**.

Pregnancy also appears to be a contributing factor in bringing about the onset of hyperpigmentation due to increased hormone levels.

The Science behind Hyperpigmentation

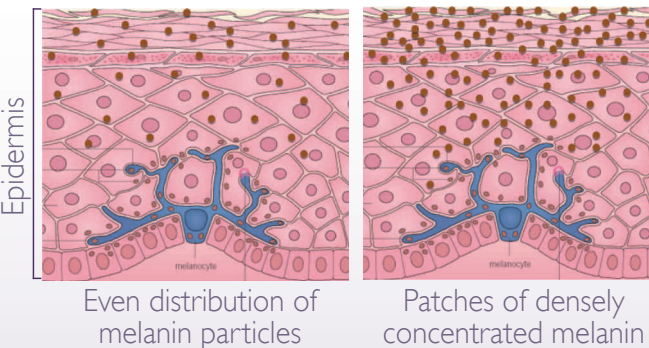
Our skin is made up of **3** main layers...



- **The Epidermis** is the outer layer of the skin that forms a protective barrier.
- **The Dermis** is the strong, supportive middle layer of the skin that gives the skin its strength and elasticity.
- **The Hypodermis** is the inner layer of the skin, consisting of fat and supportive connective tissue.

The Science behind Hyperpigmentation

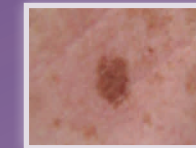
- **Melanin** is produced in the epidermis by **Melanocyte cells**.
- Melanocyte cells **make and distribute** melanin in the skin.
- The amount and distribution of melanin determines **skin colour**.
- Over production of melanin in skin leads to **hyperpigmentation**, this is where patches of densely concentrated melanin are formed instead of being evenly distributed throughout the epidermis layer...leaving darker coloured **patches** on the skin.



There are **3** main types of Hyperpigmentation

Age or 'Liver' Spots

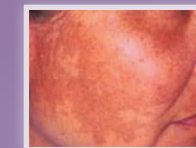
(also know as Solar Lentigos)



This is a very common form of hyperpigmentation. Generally they are small darkened patches on the skin and are usually found on the hands, arms and face. They are commonly due to frequent exposure to the sun.

Its important to remember that freckles, age spots and other darkened skin patches can become darker or more pronounced when skin is exposed to the sun. This happens because melanin absorbs the energy of the sun's harmful rays in order to protect the skin from overexposure... thus the result being skin tanning, which usually darkens areas that are already hyperpigmented.

Melasma



These are similar to age spots but are larger areas of darkened skin that appear most often as a result of hormonal changes.

Pregnancy, for example, can trigger overproduction of melanin that causes the 'mask of pregnancy' on the face and darkened skin on the abdomen and other areas. Women who take birth control pills may also develop hyperpigmentation because their bodies undergo similar kinds of hormonal changes that occur during pregnancy.

Post Inflammatory Hyperpigmentation



This occurs when a spot, insect bite or an other skin injury heals and is frequently seen in acne. It is caused by increased melanin in the healing process and will usually fade on its own.
